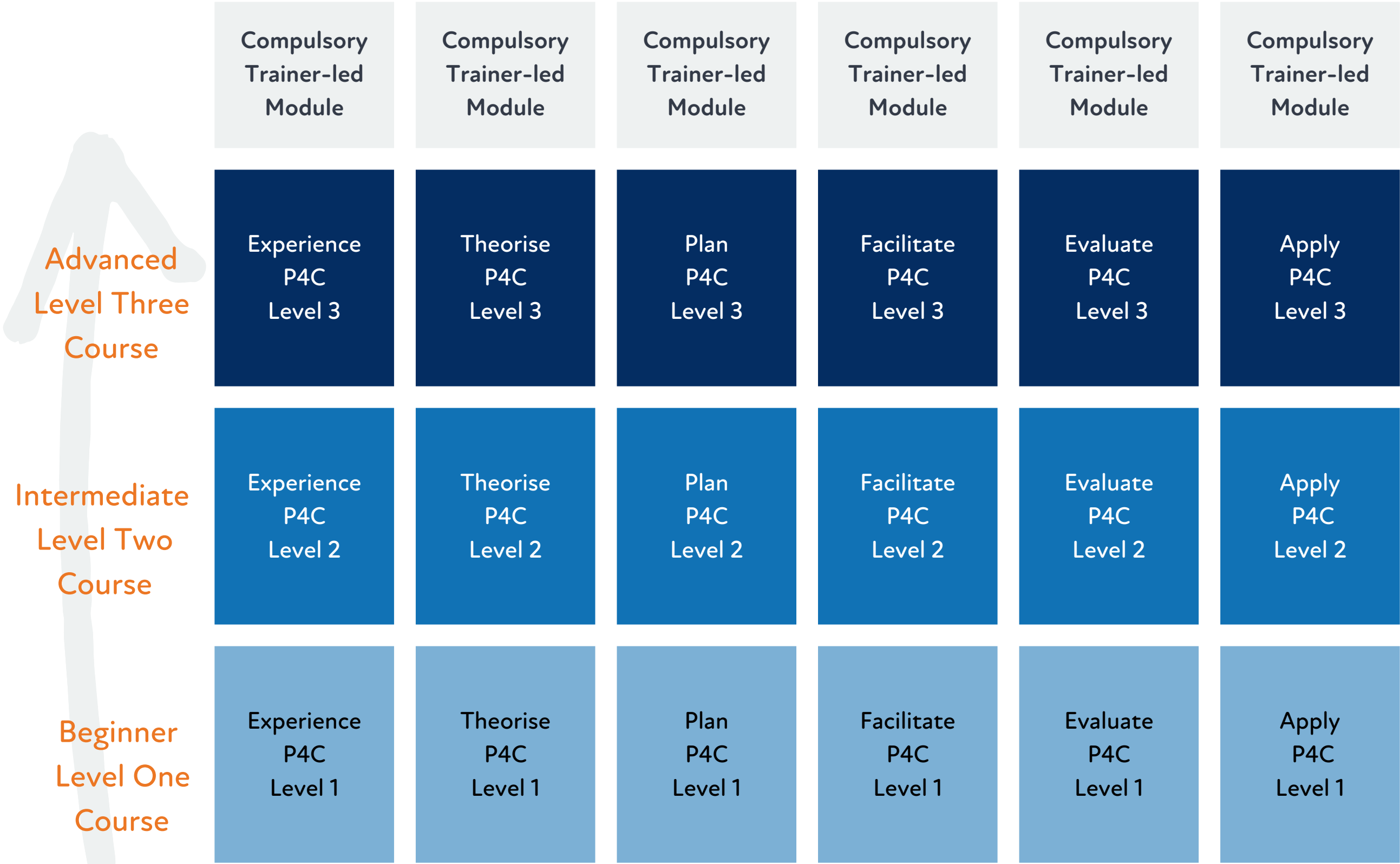
The core course

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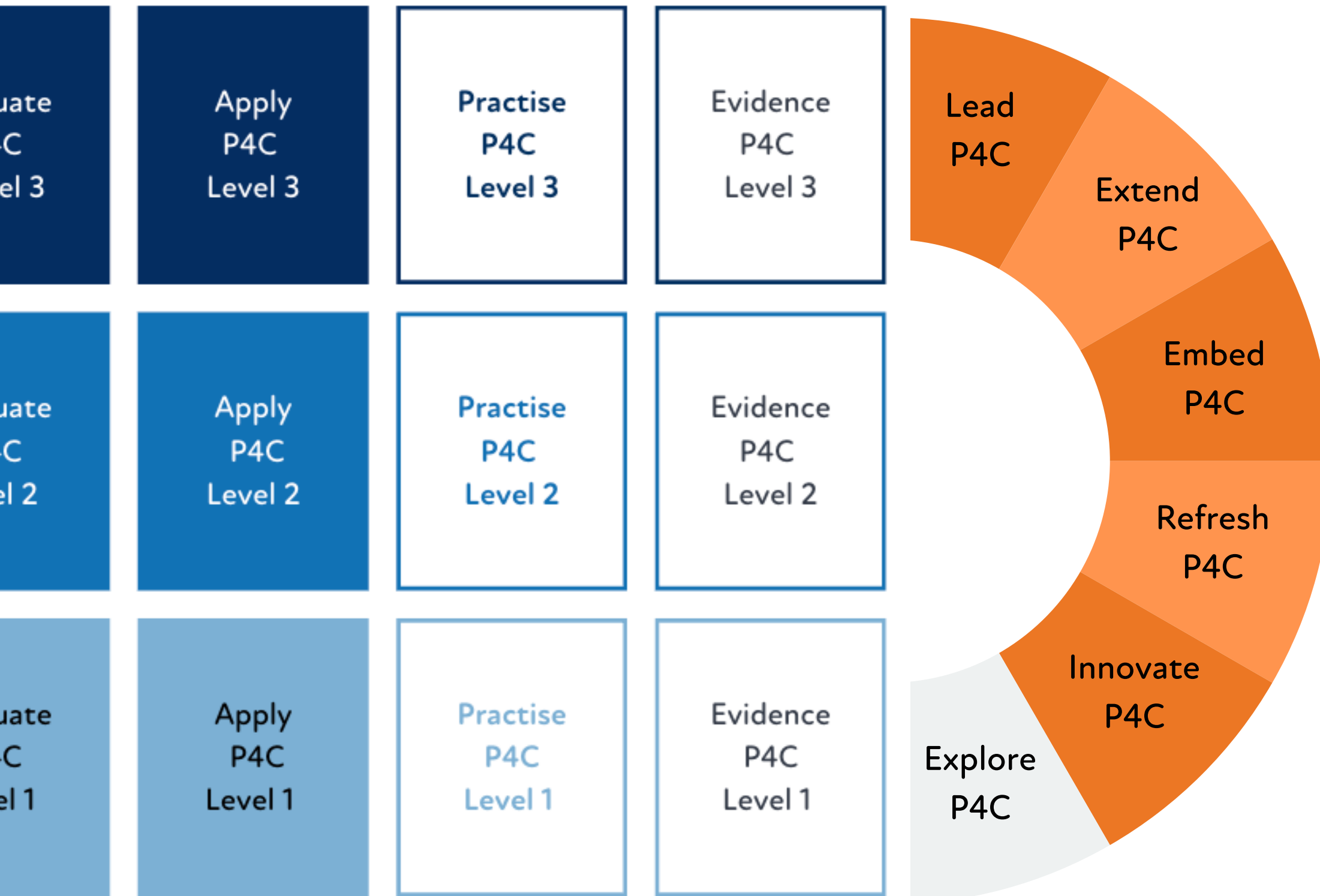
Bespoke courses

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Complementary sessions

These optional sessions complement our beginner, intermediate and advanced courses and support a diverse range of training needs and special interests.

- **Lead P4C** supports practitioners to shape the development of their colleagues P4C practice.
- **Extend P4C** offers a range of ways to develop philosophy in settings or subjects and to develop new skills. *e.g. SEND, literacy, challenging issues*
- **Embed P4C** focuses on planning P4C across all areas of the curriculum.
- **Refresh P4C** is for those who feel rusty and need a recap of the basics.
- **Innovate P4C** combines P4C with various complementary pedagogies, to explore new ways to philosophise *e.g. outdoor enquiry, dramatic enquiry*
- **Explore P4C** is a self-led route to engage with philosophical literature and media.

Experience P4C

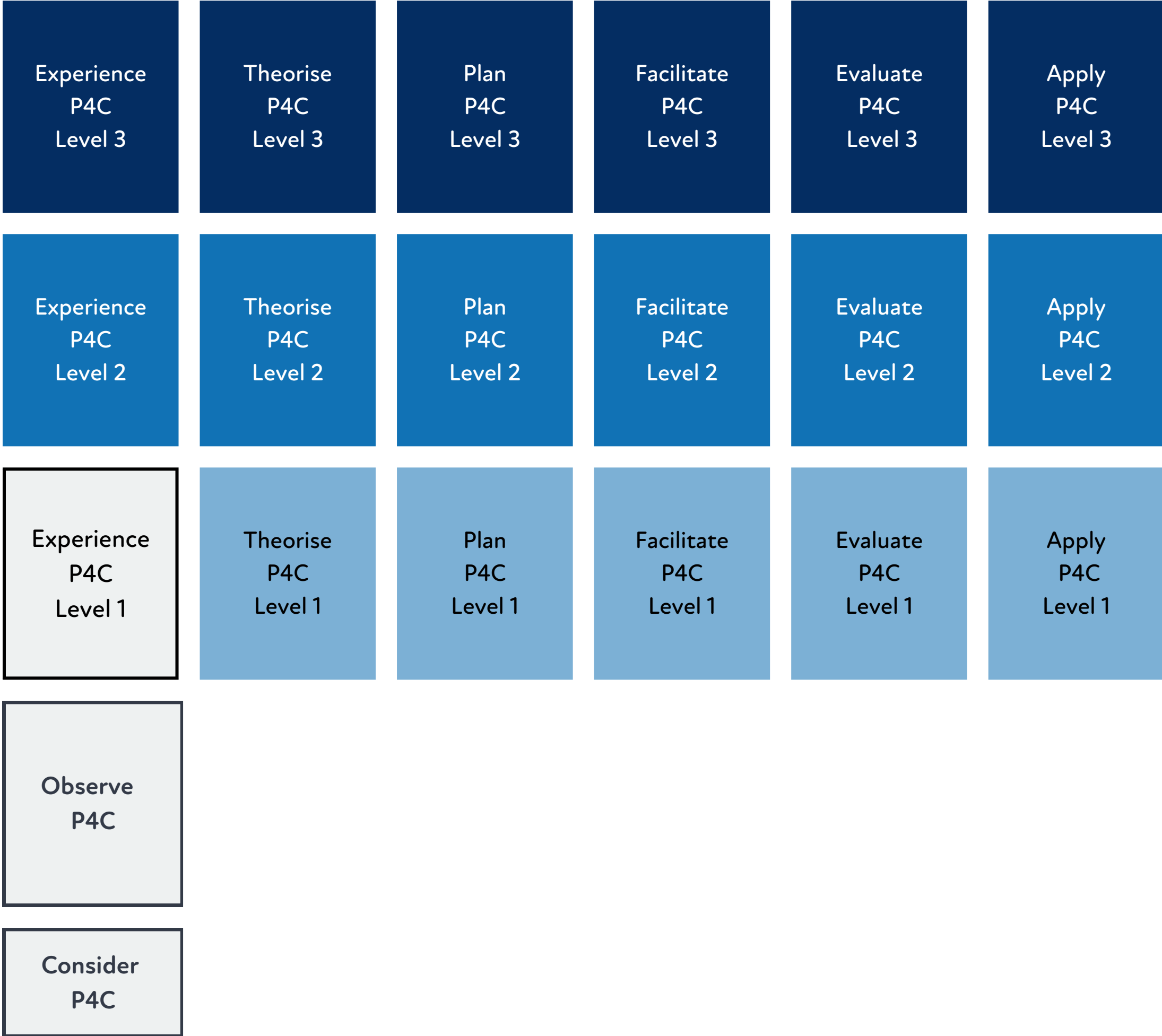
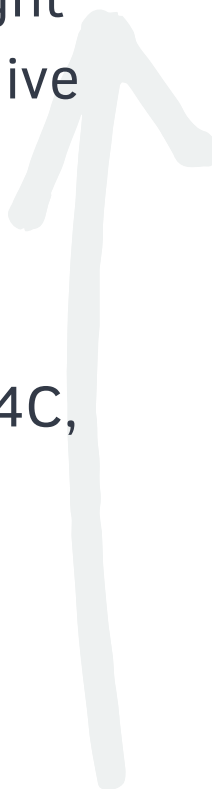
'Experience P4C' as a stand alone introduction. Delegates who complete this module, receive a discount on the rest of the course.

Consider P4C

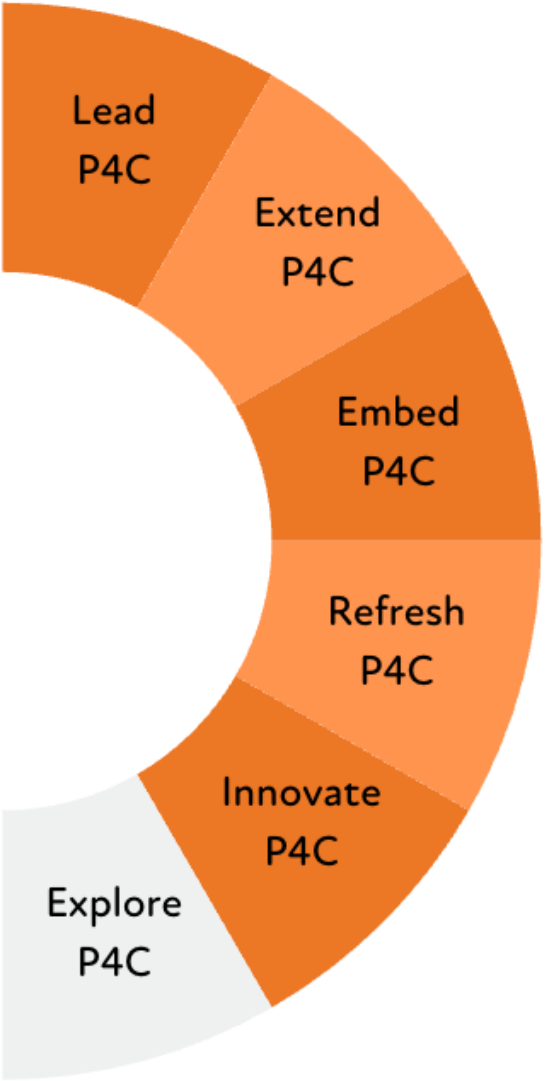

SAPERRE P4C Pathway - in full

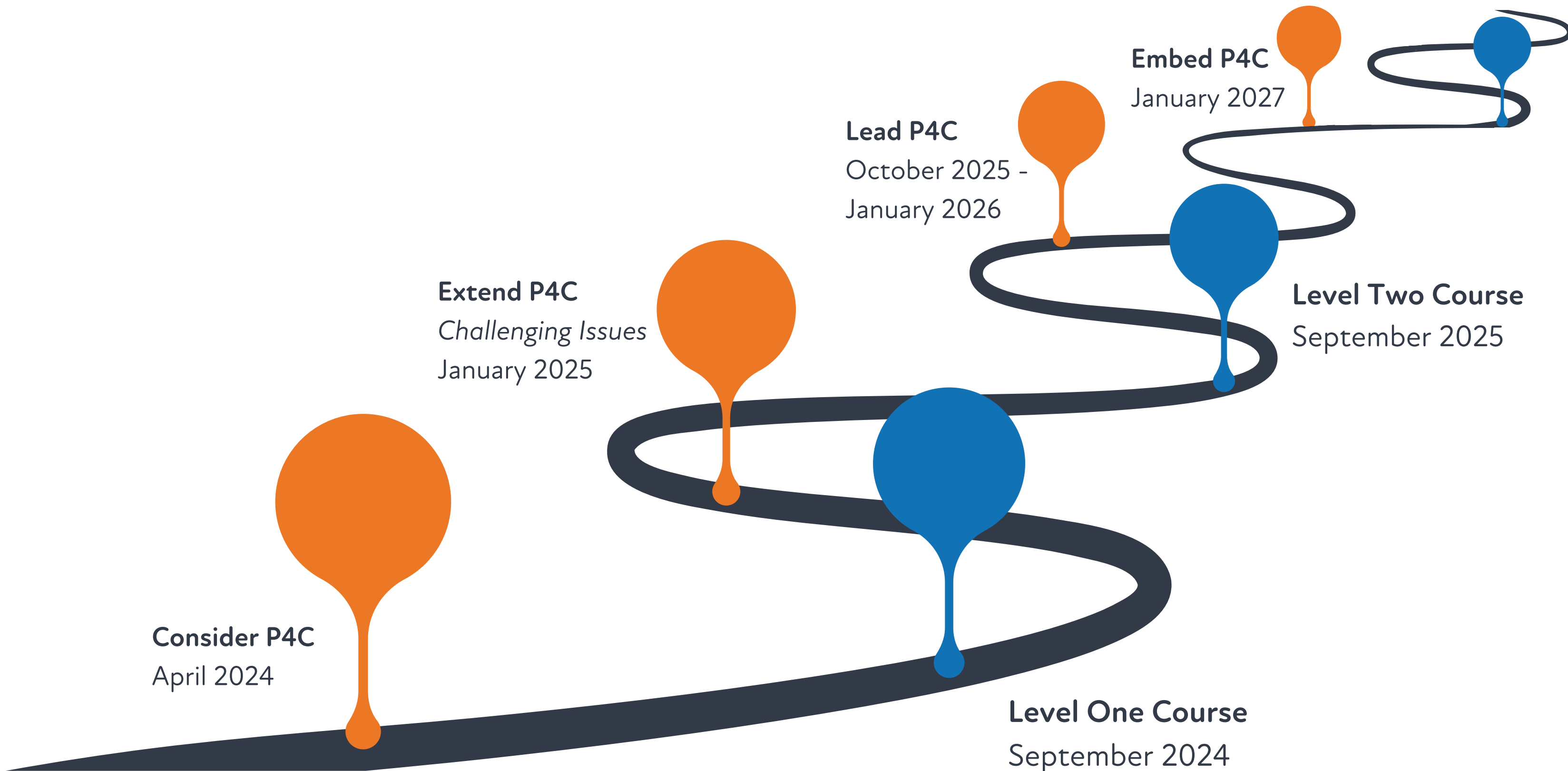
